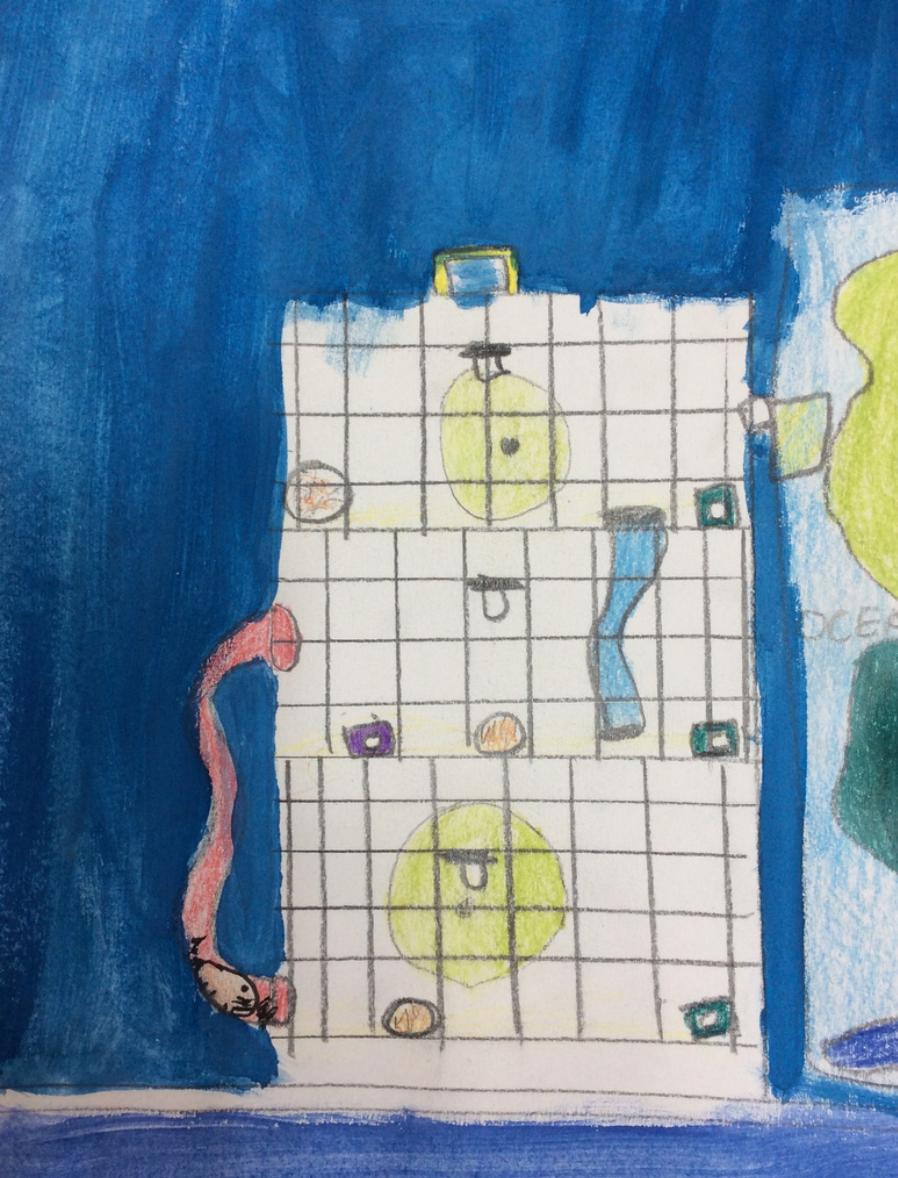

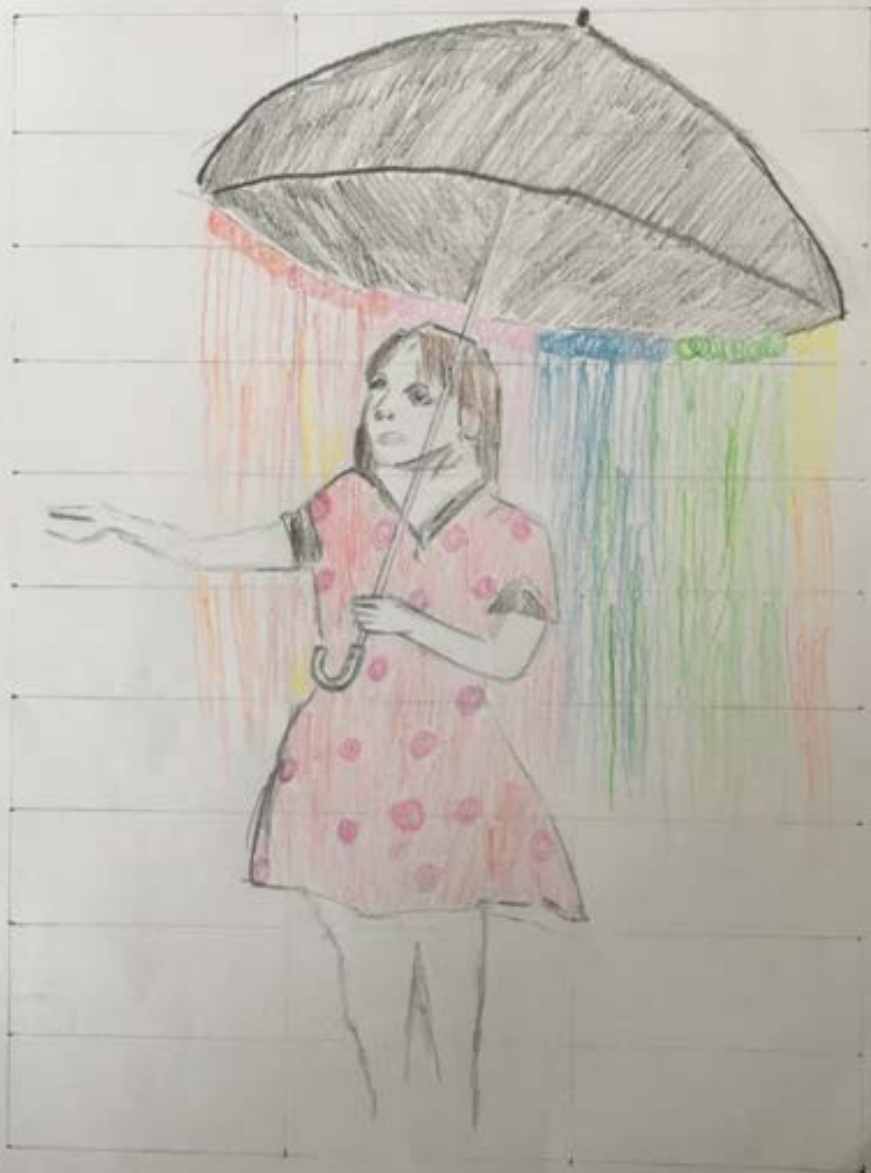

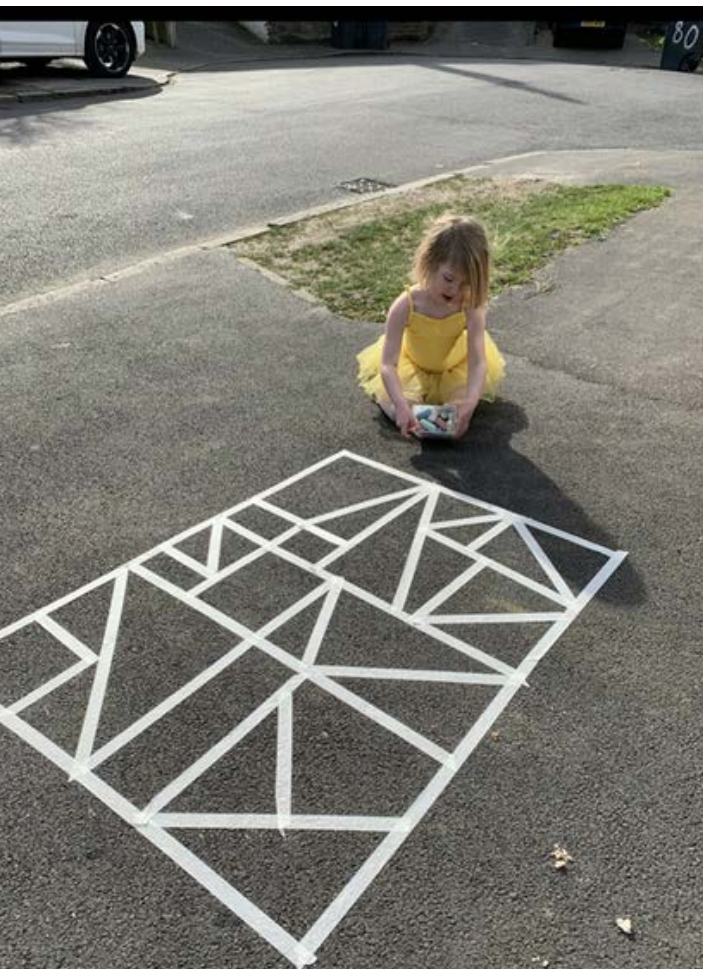

Lara made a pattern using masking tape and then used outdoor chalks to add the bright, vibrant colours.

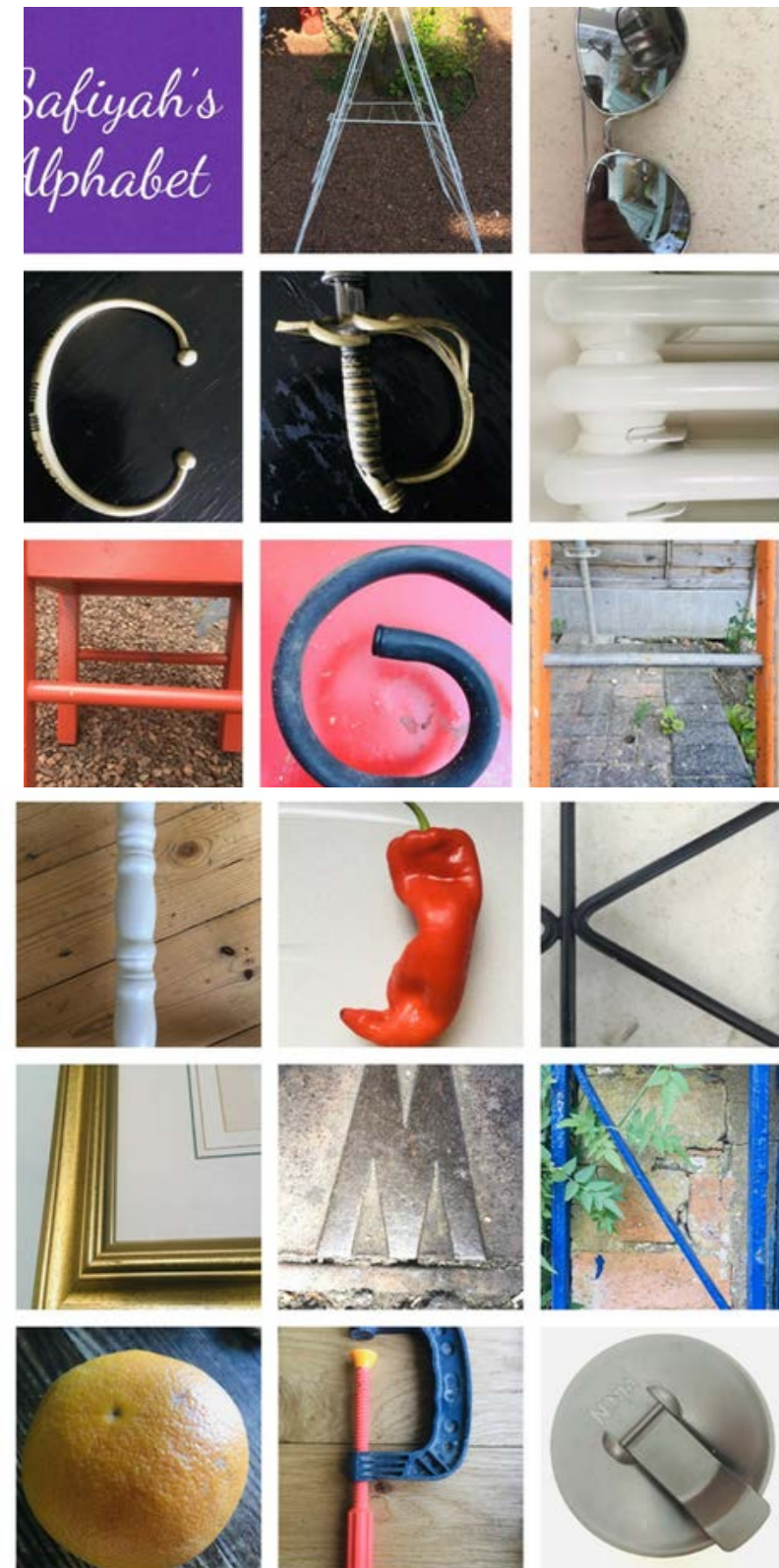

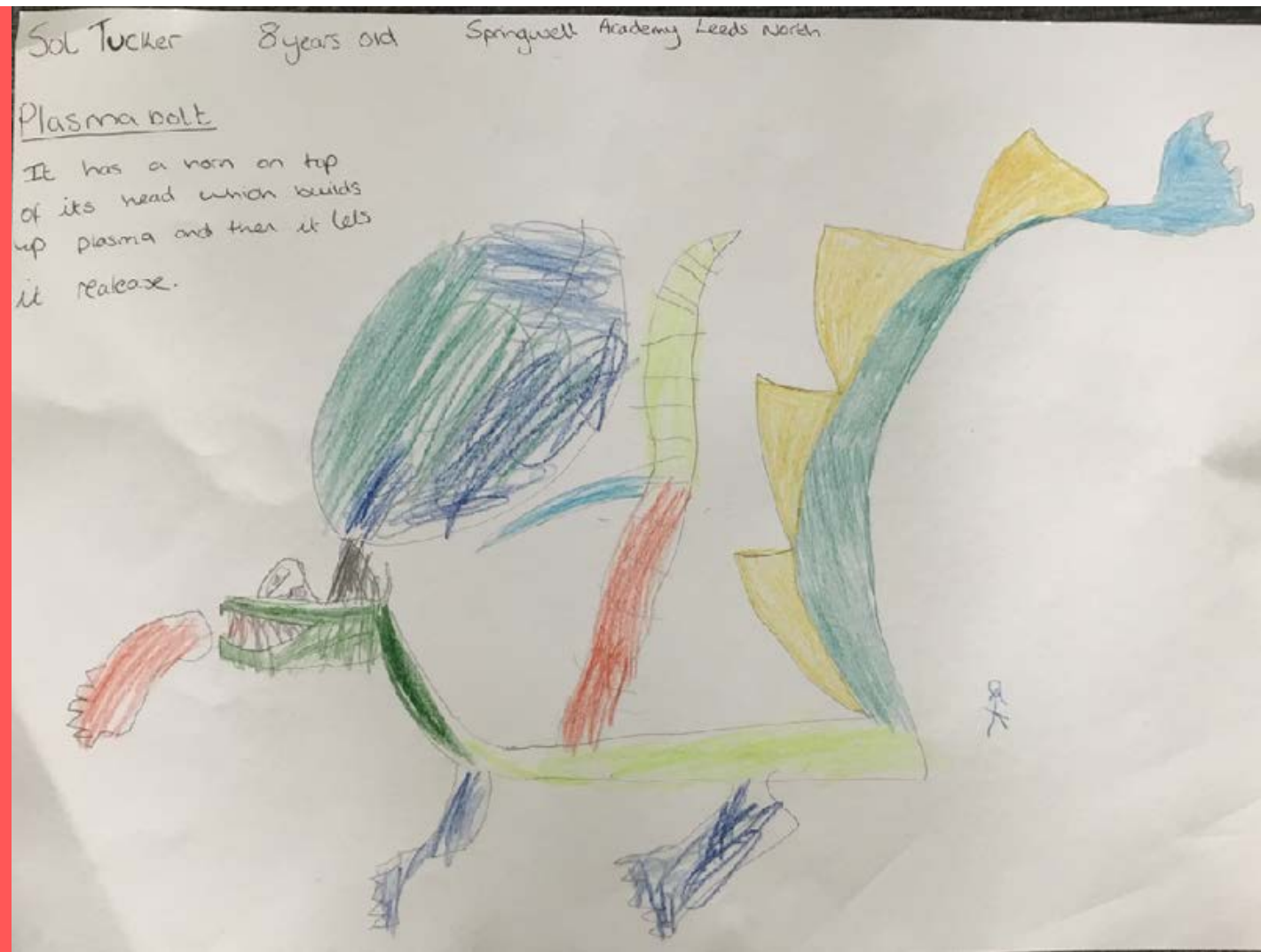

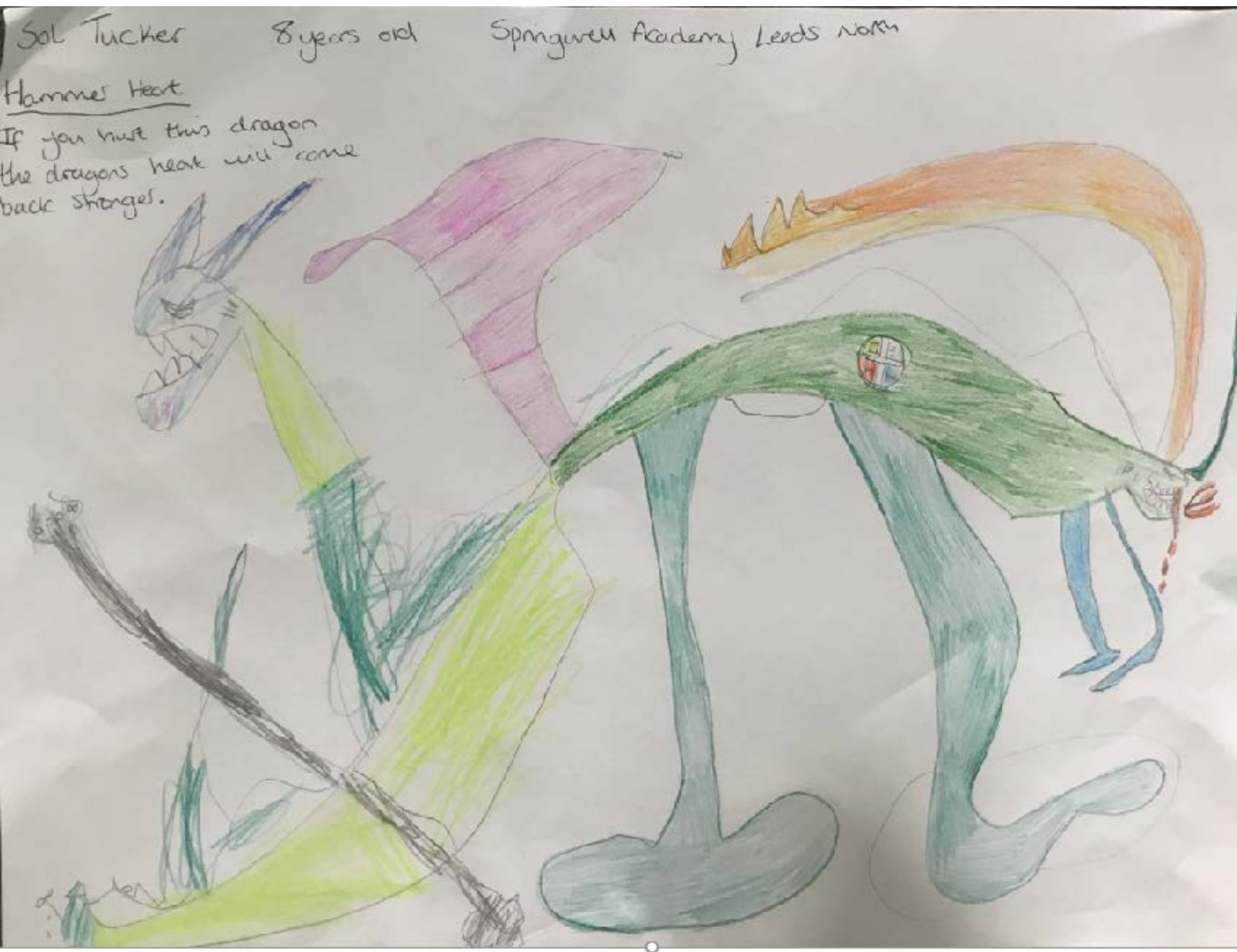

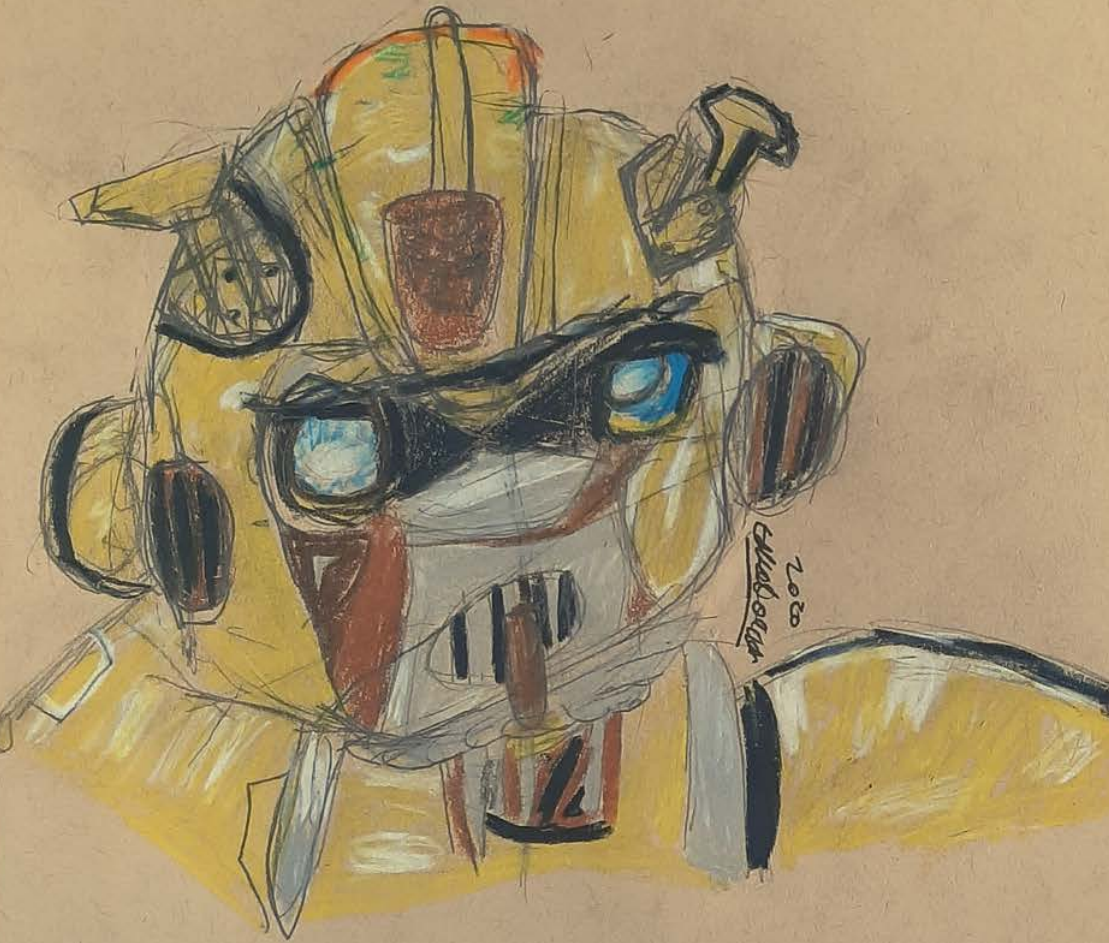
'Spix Macaw Inspired Carnival Mask'
