The author did this by using lots of movement and action verbs for winter. Today I want you to log into Education City (link on Teams assignments) and play the game Valiant Verbs then complete the worksheet to match! You can write the correct answers in your yellow book to show me!</p>	<p>Today you will complete two sheets thinking about how much money there is altogether.</p> <p>Remember that each note and coin has a different value!
