You can now see that although cocoa may represent only a small fraction of the weight of a bar of milk chocolate, it costs more than any of the other ingredients. The cost of the all ingredients in a bar makes up only around 10% of the price you pay in the shop. The rest goes on things like packaging, advertising, transport, profits, the shops' costs and tax.
