Children will learn to:

- Describe the signs of autumn using vocabulary from firsthand experience, books, songs, rhymes and poems
- Explain the changes that happen in autumn in relation to their environment- the clothes they wear, the weather, the plants, the animals
- Use their senses to make observations and learn about the world around them
- Use a hand lens to make observations
- Identify and sort based on simple categories
- Label the properties of an autumn object

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		 Collect leaves from the school grounds and bring in from home- describe colours- Red, gold, brown Use a range of books to support the teaching of autumn- fiction and non-fiction. Model how to use vocabulary from the books to describe autumn and make observations. Model how to sort autumn objects using taught vocabulary- spiky/not spiky. Smooth/not smooth 	Teach children how to use a hand lens to see the autumn objects clearly. Explain how the hand lens magnifies (makes the object look bigger) so we can see small details more clearly. Use test dishes (with magnifying glass on top) to collect autumnal objects.
